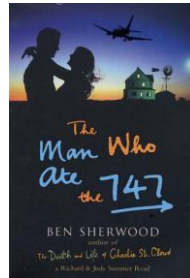

a funny and witty romp through university life in 1985 and how a small amount of information can change your life forever. This book is perfect light reading with plenty of laughs.

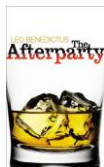


By the Bed for April 2011

(Hans Fallada)

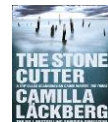
Berlin, 1940, Otto refuses to be scared by Nazi rule, starting a drop of postcards attacking Hitler bringing him to the attention of the Gestapo.

(Camilla Lackberg)

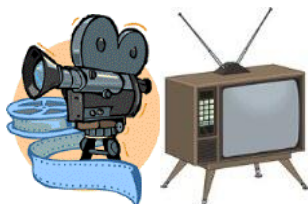
Patrik Hedstrom must investigate the murder of a child that he knew well. His investigations take him into the dark heart behind the idyllic façade of Fjallbacka.



What's New?

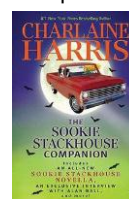
A whole new section has been created for those of you who prefer the movie/TV version of a book...or even for those of us who enjoy both!
